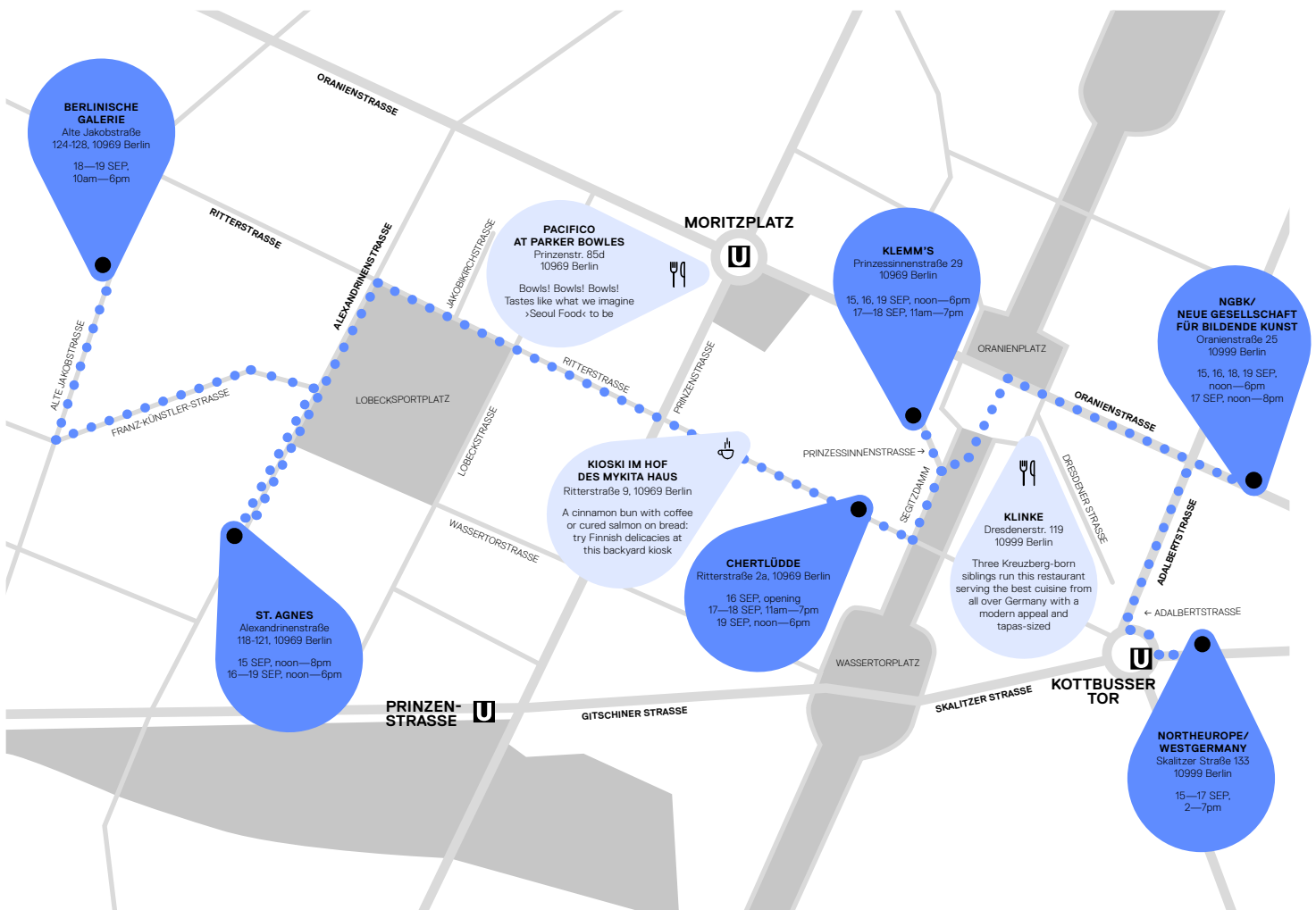


BERLIN ART WEEK x CEE CEE KIEZTOUR KREUZBERG



THIS TOUR LEADS THROUGH QUIET RESIDENTIAL ESTATES FROM THE 1960S OVER RITTERSTRASSE AND GETS MORE INTERESTING ON THE WAY EAST, WHERE THE FORMER PELIKANHAUS TODAY HOUSES THE POPULAR EYEWEAR BRAND MYKITA, AND THEN TO ORANIENSTRASSE AND ADALBERTSTRASSE, WHERE YOU CAN IMMERSE YOURSELF IN LIVELY, MULTICULTURAL KREUZBERG.

This tour begins at **Berlinische Galerie**, where installation artist Alicja Kwade explores the subject— using herself as an example—from a scientific-philosophical perspective. Might we also describe the individual as a combination of chemical elements in their body? Or as a complete data set of DNA? Not far from there, somewhat hidden, is the concrete church by architect Werner Düttmann that Johann König converted into a gallery in 2012. Its impressive, towering interior with skylights and grey shotcrete walls features up-and-coming young artists in ›MISA Discoveries‹, a presentation following König's third edition of the art fair **Messe in St. Agnes (MISA)**. At the end of lengthy Ritterstraße is **ChertLüdde**, which is showing works by the New York-based artist Juan Antonio Olivares in a pre-war flat. His video works explore states of meditation, intoxication, and hallucinations. In a rear courtyard around the

corner is **Klemm's**, housed in a former print shop building. Rattling in its space are the apparatuses of young media artist Jonas Roßmeißl, whose work questions the logic of social image production and distribution. The tour continues across Oranienplatz to the lively Oranienstraße, where artists at the **nGbK** grapple with the post-reunification period and their own position in reunified Germany. At Kottbusser Tor, specifically on the first floor of labyrinthine Zentrum Kreuzberg, is the project space **NorthEurope / WestGermany**. Conceived as a district project for art, culture, and discourse, it currently features work by conceptual artist Yvonne Wahl. From there you can take the U7 to Boddinstraße, where we'll be finishing the day with a drink and DJ sets at **BERLIN ART WEEK GARDEN**, just in front of Kindl—Centre for Contemporary Art.
