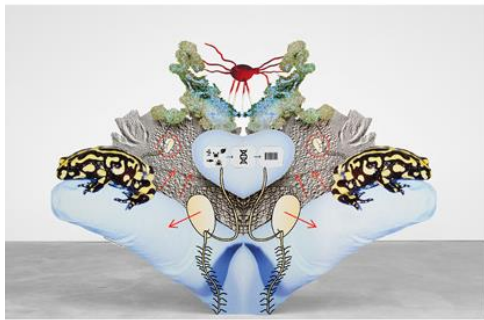

A Tour of Berlin—Art All Across Town

Discover Berlin anew with art!

On the trail of art and culture: thanks to the many institutions involved, exhibitions and performances during this year's Berlin Art Week will be taking place in unusual locations. From the Tieranatomisches Theater to Fahrbereitschaft, from Wedding to Hellersdorf: Art will become a matrix that is laid over the city's topography, making it doubly worthwhile to pursue its tracks across Berlin.

HALLEN #3—Wilhelm Hallen

Reinickendorf Rules

To mark Berlin Art Week, Wilhelm Hallen in Reineckendorf will be presenting the third round of a free and intuitively curated group exhibition with fifteen participating galleries from Berlin: alexander levy, carlier I gebauer, ChertLüdde, Efremidis Gallery, Esther Schipper, Helga-Maria Klosterfelde, HUA International, Klemm's, Mehdi Chouakri, neugerriemschneider, Nome, PSM, Soy Capitán, Sprüth Magers and Sweetwater. For the galleries of the Initiative K60, it is important to further promote dialogue and discussion between galleries and the rest of the Berlin art world to create space for developing new ideas and the joint use of resources.

HAU HEBBEL AM UFER—Technikmuseum Berlin

Tactical Tech—Everything Will Be Fine

Hebbel am Ufer will be presenting itself at Berlin Art Week with an exhibition in cooperation with Tactical Tech in an unusual place where visitors are involved to participate and marvel: in a structure located on the forecourt of Deutsches Technikmuseum designed by the Czech architectural firm Kogaa, works by artists of international stature such as Paolo Cirio, Marjolijn Dijkman, Disnovation.org, Vladan Joler, Egor Kraft, Agnieszka Kurant, Sybille Neumeyer, Liam Young will be presented. Together, they will create a space for reflection, discussion, and interaction. Visitors will be encouraged to engage with their personal reactions to crises, from fight or flight to escapism and speculation or other possibilities of action.

HAUBROK FOUNDATION—Fahrbereitschaft

Summer Celebration—Something in the Air

From 2 September to 29 October, an event series on New Music will take place at Fahrbereitschaft under the title ›Something in the Air‹. Especially on the evening of 17 September, it will become a highlight of the festival into the night: the ensemble KNM, with conductor and composer Ari Benjamin Meyers and the artist David Zink Yi will be among the participants. These contributions will be accompanied by two exhibitions and sound works from the Haubrok Collection, including artists Martin Creed, Jason Dodge, Isa Genzken, Rodney Graham, Pierre Huyghe, Emily Jacir, Jonathan Monk, Stephen Prina, David Shrigley, Anri Sala, and Heimo Zobernig.

IFA-GALERIE BERLIN—Open Air Performances

Spheres of Interest*

The exhibition series ›Out of the Box‹ at ifa Galerie Berlin engages with individual works from the ifa art collection that are subject to an artistic-curatorial revision. In the current exhibition ›Spheres of Interest*‹, the artists Isaac Chong Wai, Lizza May David, Wilhelm Klotzek, Ofri Lapid, Adrien Missika, and Gitte Villesen open a dialogue shaped by various artistic approaches with select artworks from the collection. During Berlin Art Week, the exhibition will spread across the entire city: from the home location of ifa-Galerie Berlin in Mitte to Neue Nationalgalerie, Montbijou Bridge and other exciting locations.

KW ON LOCATION—Tieranatomisches Theater

Rachel Rossin—The Maw Of

The work of Rachel Rossin represents the physical aspect of the body as part of a larger technological structure. An exciting meeting of body, machine, perception, and code that in the framework of current research emerges at the interface between the brain and the computer. At the focus of the project: a site-specific installation at Tieranatomisches Theater (TA T) in Berlin that will be presented in the framework of KW Institute for Contemporary Art's digital programme. In addition, an online work commissioned jointly by KW and New York's Whitney Museum of American Art will be seen on the websites of KW and the Whitney Museum in September. An interactive feedback loop will link the computer screens of the visitors and their smart phone displays.

LAGE EGAL [KIMGO]

Lina Mazonett & David Quiroga

The name says it all: Lage Egal, or ›location irrelevant‹, a project space founded by artists, has been pursuing a nomadic and experimental concept since 2010. During Berlin Art Week, the space will be a guest at Kimgo in Prenzlauer Berg with an exhibition of the artist duo Lina Mazonett & David Quiroga, that along with eight other artists was nominated for the Berlin Art Prize. By linking the Western disciplines of geology, astronomy, and economy with cosmological, ritual, and social knowledge, they underscore that indigenous knowledge systems have the same justification as Western science to contribute to understanding to world around us.

NGBK—station urbaner kulturen

station urbaner kulturen / Hellersdorf

With station urbaner kulturen, nGbK has established a second, new space for debates and initiatives in Hellersdorf. During Berlin Art Week, nGbK will be presenting: ›Salud - Picasso Speaking: »Guernica« und der Krieg in den Städten‹ (Salud: Picasso Speaking, ›Guernica‹ and the War in Cities). The exhibition will take up traces and strands of (art) stories linked to Picasso and place them in relationship to current conflicts. In his historical pictorial studies, conceptual painter Dierck Schmidt will take the highly secured presentation of the painting ›Guernica‹ at Madrid's Museum Reina Sofia as an occasion for a new production.
