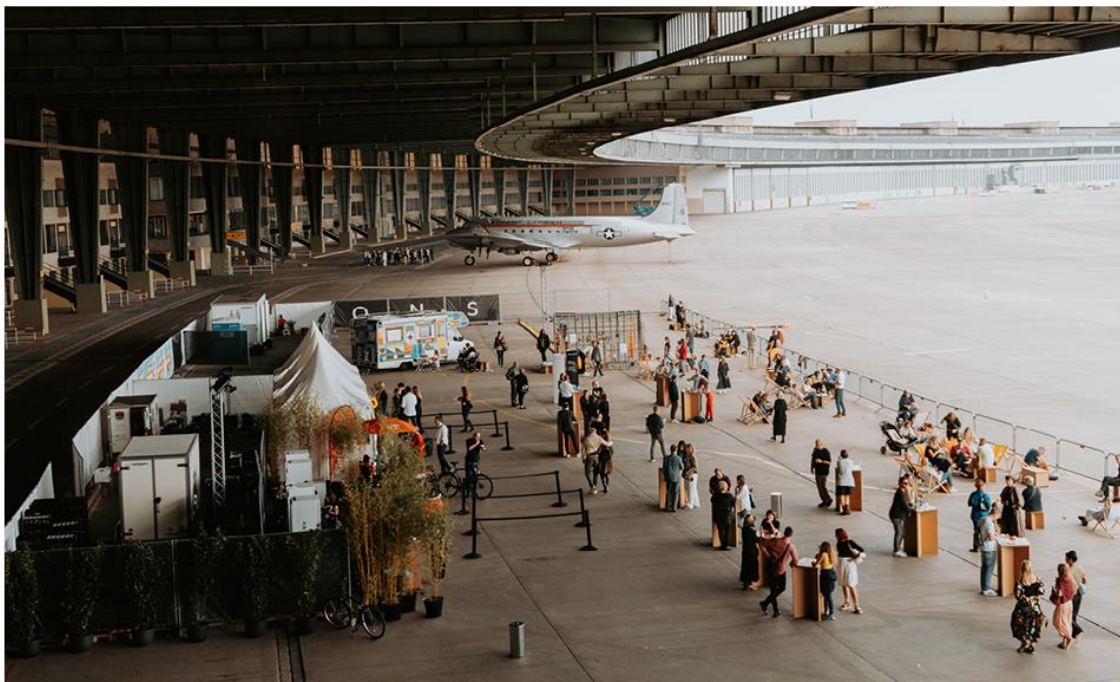

### **Berlin Art Week 2022—Galleries All around Town and at the Art Fair at Tempelhof**

**This promises to be a rousing start for the fall season: numerous galleries across town, at Wilhelm Hallen, and the art fair Positions Berlin at the former airport Tempelhof are all part of Berlin Art Week.**

**In Berlin's celebration of art, the galleries are of course essential: internationally active and located all around the city, they are a fixed part of Berlin Art Week. During the festival week, over 50 galleries will be enticing visitors with extended opening hours. Positions Art Fair is also key: in 2022, it is inviting guests for the ninth time as part of Berlin Art Week to the former airport Tempelhof. 88 galleries from twenty countries will be presenting their programmes, featuring well-known Berlin galleries.**

## Positions Berlin Art Fair

What began as a meeting place for art lovers and art dealers more than ten years ago has in recent years become a permanent programme highlight to kick off the fall and Berlin Art Week. Today, [Positions Berlin Art Fair](#) is an important player among art fairs internationally and domestically, combining committed and new collectors with galleries and their up-and-coming artists and their works.

From 15—18 SEP 2022 the Positions Berlin Art Fair will take place once again at Hangars 5—6 of the former airport Tempelhof, welcoming creative minds from around the world and focusing on the art market of the German capital.

With 88 galleries from 20 countries, Positions Berlin will be showing visitors a comprehensive range of participants. Young talents such as Marta Djourina, Shinoh Nam und Yannick Ackah will be presented alongside established figures of art history: Eduard Bargheer, Vera Molnar, Lotte Laserstein, and Paul McCarthy. The fair will be complemented by a diverse auxiliary programme of events.

## Exhibitions at Berlin's Galleries for Berlin Art Week

As an art city, Berlin is above all a vital place of art production: numerous prominent and aspiring artists live and work in the capital. A dynamic network of galleries provides them a stage and presents their works to the public.

From 12 to 6 pm, 15—18 SEP, a total of 53 Berlin galleries will be presenting artistic works that are pioneering in Berlin and around the world and set new trends. Included here are established artists like Rosa Barba at Esther Schipper, LaToya Ruby Frazier and Jon Rafman at Sprüth Magers, and Carrie Mae Weems at Galerie Barbara Thumm. In addition, young artists who live and work in Berlin will be shown, such as Hannah Sophie Dunkelberg at Efremidis, Philipp Modersohn at Guido W. Baudach, and Mario Pfeiffer at KOW.

## Hallen #3, Wilhelm Hallen

For Berlin Art Week, the listed site [Wilhelm Hallen](#) in Berlin-Reinickendorf will for the third time be the centre of the curated group exhibition ›Reinickendorf Rules‹. Fifteen prominent Berlin galleries have joined efforts in this collaboration: alexander levy, carlier | gebauer, ChertLüdde, Efremidis Gallery, Esther Schipper, Helga-Maria Klosterfelde, HUA International, Klemm's, Mehdi Chouakri, neugerriemschneider, Nome, PSM, Soy Capitán, Sprüth Magers, and Sweetwater. For the galleries of the Initiative K60, it is important to further promote dialogue and discussion between galleries and the rest of the Berlin art world to create space for developing new ideas and the joint use of resources.

## VBKI-Preis Berliner Galerien

The shortlist for the VBKI-Preis Berliner Galerien 2022 makes us eagerly await the presentations of those nominated. For the sixth gallery prize, the Berlin galleries Galerie Thomas Fischer with Sebastian Stumpf, Office Impart with Anna Ehrenstein, and Soy Capitán with Caroline Wong are in the running. The prize will be awarded to one of the short-listed galleries for an especially important exhibition during Berlin Art Week and for its general program. On 16 September, the expert juries will award the 10,000-euro prize to one of the three nominees.
