## Festival centre >Berlin Art Week Garten< hosted by Hamburger Bahnhof

As part of its 14th edition, Berlin Art Week is pleased to announce that this year's festival centre —the >Berlin Art Week Garten<—will be hosted at Hamburger Bahnhof – Nationalgalerie der Gegenwart.

From 10—14 SEP 2025, Berlin Art Week invites the public to experience a wide-ranging programme of contemporary art across the city. For five days, the green outdoor area of Hamburger Bahnhof will transform into a lively space for encounters and exchange, animated by performances, talks, workshops, screenings, and DJ sets. At the same time, the Berlin Art Week Garten invites visitors to pause and linger as they make their way through the city-wide art parcours—with features such as a reading garden, coffee and aperitif bars, and a variety of culinary options.

The Berlin Art Week Garten is the central hub for all information related to Berlin Art Week—from suggested routes across the city to an overview of the full programme with more than 100 partners, and details on individual events. The garden provides space to plan your personal route, take a break, connect with others, or wind down your day in a relaxed atmosphere.

Those visiting the Berlin Art Week Garten will also have the chance to discover Hamburger Bahnhof's new programme: on Wednesday, 10 SEP, Petrit Halilaj will open his major solo exhibition, curated by Catherine Nichols. In celebration of Berlin Art Week, special events will accompany the artist's first institutional solo exhibition in Berlin.
